

Sunday Services in October

Oct. 1, 10:00 a.m. Love the Stranger. Rev. Jim Magaw.
What does it mean to "love the stranger"--a concept that is present in a number of different religious traditions? Do we really have to love people we don't even know or with whom we might not have anything in common? How do set about such a task? *Designated Offering: American Red Cross of Southwestern Pennsylvania serves Allegheny, Greene, and Washington counties and is part of the 28-county Western Pennsylvania Region. They also provide training and transportation for volunteers who travel to help with national disaster relief efforts, including relief for victims of the recent hurricanes in Texas and Florida.*

Oct. 8, 10:00 a.m. Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, Justice. Rev. Jim Magaw.
For decades, many institutions and organizations-including the church-have emphasized diversity and inclusion as important values. We often talk of celebrating diversity and striving to be more inclusive. But are diversity and inclusion enough? This sermon will explore how an emphasis on diversity and inclusion may sometimes keep us from working for real justice and equity.

Oct. 15, 10:00 a.m. Welcoming Congregation Celebration. Rev. Jim Magaw and Interweave.
Last year our congregation renewed our status as a "Welcoming Congregation" with the Unitarian Universalist Association. We are grateful for the work of many in our congregation who engaged in this process. How do we continue to live into our status as a welcoming congregation? *Designated Offering: Circle of Faith is a Pittsburgh interfaith organization dedicated to welcoming and inclusion for LGBTQ persons, their families and allies in varied faith communities. Circle of Faith sponsors and organizes public witness events and worship services for all who are welcoming, affirming and embracing.*

Oct. 22.10:00 a.m. Consecration Service. Rev. Lee Barker.
As part of our building dedication weekend, we will consecrate our new sanctuary and consider: What does it mean to make a space sacred? How will we choose to bless this place? And how will we bless the world through this space?

Oct. 29. 10:00 a.m. All Souls Day. Rev. Jim Magaw.
In the Christian tradition, All Souls Day has been a time to remember everyone who has died, everyone who has been part of the gathered community. The phrase "All Souls" has a particularly Unitarian connotation because of something that one of our own "saints," William Ellery Channing, "I am a living member of the great Family of All Souls; and I cannot improve or suffer myself without diffusing good or evil around me through an ever-enlarging sphere. What does it mean for us to be a community of All Souls in the 21st century?"

Oct. 29, 7:00 p.m. Samhain Ritual. Spirtways.

Samhain, meaning "Summer's End," is a Gaelic holiday, marking the third and final harvest festival of the year. By now, the last of the fields have been gathered. The leaves, bereft of gold and fire, lie brown and lifeless at our feet, and the earth begins to die around us as we watch the wheel of the year turn towards the dark and cold part of the year. It is also a time to honor our ancestors, those who came before us--our beloved dead--and celebrate their memory. On this night, the veil between the worlds is thinnest, and thusly, we look to reconnect with our loved ones, speak their names, remember their presence and hope to receive advice or guidance for the upcoming year. As this is a high holiday, attendees are asked to wear black. Food and drink contributions to cakes and ale are always welcome, especially seasonal items. Due to the powerful quality of rituals, children 12 and older only please, unless otherwise noted. Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult.

Suggested Items for Samhain:

- Mementos of your beloved dead/ancestors for the ancestor altar
- Food for sharing at cakes and ale
- Wear black

The Israelites carried with them the many bodily wounds and indignities they had suffered in Egypt. And they began the process of transformation with singing and dancing. It was just the beginning of their journey, to be sure. But Miriam knew that, if they were to have any chance of healing, any chance of transforming their suffering, that the change had to start with their bodies and not just their minds.

Let us celebrate in the spirits of the ancient Israelites with our hearts and our minds. Let us be grateful to one another and to all who have made our journey possible. And let us welcome all who join us for the next steps in our life as a congregation renewed, refreshed, and re-energized.

The Board of Trustees met on Tuesday, September 12, 2017.

- Peg Hart and Deny McCracken reported from the New Home Committee, discussing final items on builder's punch list and some changes that are needed.
- Peg also reviewed final details for the donor wall, which will recognize all gifts to the Capital Campaign, as well as individual plaques for key rooms and spaces.
- Janie Elliott reviewed the process for a small (250 households) postcard mailing to promote the September Meet & Greet events.
- The board is hosting a cluster-wide board training event at Sunnyhill on **Fri., Sept. 22**. Board members from area UU churches will be attending and getting their first look at our new space!

[Courage for Racial Justice, Courage for Collective Liberation Training](#), February 17, 2018 sponsored by the Southern and MidAmerica Regions in Louisville, KY. Unitarian Universalist and Social Justice Facilitator, Chris Crass will offer a one day workshop entitled "Courage for Racial Justice, Courage for Collective Liberation." Workshop will begin with brief worship and include small and large group discussions, storytelling from preselected congregations, theological reflection, and participatory exercise. Concluding segment will focus on "What are you bringing back to your congregation?" and "How will you be accountable for your plan?" Workshop will close with "Revival for Racial Justice" testimonials. The purpose of this workshop is to help build SJ communities and cultures rooted in UU values with the courage to do racial justice work. Focus will be on encouraging activism and leaders, building capacity, and putting UU congregations in touch with one another.
